2021

- Baseballs NOCSEA + NFHS
  - All levels of High School baseball must have the NOCSEA + NFHS stamped balls
- Catcher Chest protector NOCSEA
  - All chest protectors in 2020 must have the NOCSEA stamp
- Pitching Positions
  - $\circ$  Pivot foot + free foot
  - Ex. Rule NFHS; a pitcher working from the set must stop regardless if runners are on base or not
- The new DH rule
  - Any position player may also be listed as a DH
  - o Ex: Deshaies RF/DH
    - This must be listed as so on the line-up card given to umpire in pre-game meeting
    - 1. Must be listed on P.U., line-up card, the official one.
    - 2. Only the original player/fielder/DH can be used in this position
    - 3. Once substituted for offensively the DH position is eliminated
    - 4. If substituted for defensively he may come back one time defensively

Points of Emphasis

- 1. Ten run rule
- 2. Force play slide rule
- 3. Enforcement of NFHS jewelry rule
- 4. Compliance of players equipment
- 5. Restriction to dugout
  - a. Assistant coach restricted
  - b. Restriction requirements

MPA Bulletin

- 1. Thunder/Lightening
- 2. Pitching rule
  - a. Pitches reverting back
- 3. Catcher's mask/throat protector
- 4. Post-game ejections
- 5. Varsity JV batting orders

**Other Situations** 

- 1. Taunting
- 2. Coaches umpire discussions on rules misinterpretations

Warn/Restrict/Eject

Travel

- umpires traveling alone
- MPA can't mandate this but AD can work with assignor

Lineup cards

• coaches exchange ahead of time

HP conference

- umpires, head coach, one captain
- no handshakes, mask worn, social distance
- take lineup cards and check, PU lineup card is official card
- ask: sportsmanship, legal equipment, trainer on site, and do you have person supplying legal NOCSEA baseballs to the PU?

Baseballs: must have NOCSEA and NFHS stamps on them

- supplied by the home team
  - home team gets balls to PU, replenish at end of each inning and after 3-4 foul balls
  - PU gets balls to pitcher

Dugouts

• may be extended by rule book regulations

- o no coaches outside dugout closer to hp
- if chairs are outside of extended dugout there must be a chalked line
- teams may extend dugout towards hp if personnel is protected by screen

Mask

- Must be worn by all participants, including umpires
  - umpire mask must be medical mask or dark one solid color
  - o pitchers mask may not be white or gray

Coaches questions with umpires

- coaches may come to foul line to ask for:
  - 1.possible pulled foot situation, request may or may not be granted
  - 2. question of possible missed rule interpretation
- coaches may not come out to discuss a judgement call, by NFHS rule book

Pitcher wet cloth in pocket

 pitchers may have a water based wet cloth in their back pocket to moisten their fingers but must wipe fingers off before touching the ball

- penalty: call time and award one ball to the batter for each offense, no warnings
- the cloth may not be white or gray if it shows in any way

Disinfectant

- bats and helmets shared by players must be disinfected between uses
  - having a disinfectant in the-on deck circle may help enforce this protocol

Two umpire system

PU out by pitcher and second umpire on first base line

 a two-umpire system with the above positioning was developed by:

1. officials commissioner: Jeff Benson

2. State of Maine baseball rules interpreter: Dan Deshaies

3. MPA liaison: Kevin Joyce
